New Course Proposals:

AP/COMN 3740 3.00 Screen Cultures

This course examines the cultural and social dimensions of screens in historical and contemporary contexts. Screen cultures include film, TV, video, digital, and mobile media. Prerequisite: None. Course credit exclusions: None.

AP/COMN 4530 3.00 Surveillance, media and society

This course analyzes the development of what has been called the 'surveillance society.' The course combines theoretical and empirical studies, and ranges from debates over security-based surveillance to studies of the ubiquitous surveillance in the contexts of social media. Prerequisite: None. Course credit exclusions: None.

AP/COMN 4531 3.00 Advanced topics in surveillance studies

This course explores the emergence of a 'surveillance society,' with particular attention to the role of surveillance in the contemporary media landscape. The course will focus on a small number of case studies, each of which will be considered in depth. Prerequisite: None. Course exclusions: None.

AP/KOR 4050 6.00 Advanced Korean for Business

The goal of the course is to provide students with Korean linguistic proficiency at a level that allows them to conduct business activities. This course aims to enhance students' proficiency to the advanced level while covering specialized vocabulary and expressions used in a wide range of business settings in Korea. Prerequisite: KOR 3000 or equivalent level of knowledge in the Korean language. Course credit exclusion: None. Language of Instruction: Korean.
