ITEMS FOR ACTION (2):

1. Nominations: Council Standing Committees

The Executive Committee recommends the following candidates for election to Vice-Chair of Council and Council Standing Committees effective November 1, 2010. Nominations are also accepted from the floor of Council. A final approval for the slate of nominees is given by Council on a motion that nominations be closed, as moved by the Vice-Chair of Council.

Background and Rationale:

Given the recently approved changes to the Rules and Procedures of Council in September 2010, the Executive Committee, in accordance with article 1.4(iv) of the Rules and Procedures of Council, felt it necessary to communicate points of principle to serve as a guideline and process for interpreting the new rules, as well as the existing rules of the respective committees. The following six principles were therefore developed in order to inform the nominations process (with reference to the Rules and Procedures where applicable):

- 1. With the exception of the Committee on Student Academic Petitions, and the Committee on Student Appeals and Academic Integrity, committees cannot have representation from more than one member of any unit (article 6);
- 2. In cases where there is more than one nomination from a unit, the nominee with the greatest number of votes will be elected:
- 3. Cross-appointed individuals are nominated according to their official home unit;
- 4. Non-succession does not apply to those individuals who served on a Council committee during 2009-10 for a one-year term; in such instances, these individuals may be elected to serve a new three-year term (article 1.5);
- 5. Individuals currently serving on one or more committees may continue to do so until those terms expire, but may not be nominated for another committee until the term has expired (article 1.3);
- 6. All committees should have representation from Humanities, Social Sciences, and Professional Programs (article 6).

Affixed as an appendix to this report is a chart which lists the current incumbents and nominees for each Council committee. The Executive Committee circulates this document as a way to inform Council of the current membership of Council committees and also to promote discussion of unit and disciplinary representation.
